In recent decades, stringent drug policies have helped cause the U.S. prison population to swell to more than 2 million. Recognizing the potential of art to shed light on issues surrounding drugs and incarceration, this year, Fresh A.I.R. Gallery has sought artwork by currently and formerly incarcerated individuals whose lives have been affected by substance use. Select pieces were to be featured in a group exhibition at the gallery in July 2020. Unfortunately, the COVID-19 pandemic has altered these plans, both temporarily closing the physical Fresh A.I.R. Gallery space and making it more difficult for incarcerated artists to obtain needed art supplies and submit their work. We have decided to postpone the full exhibition until these issues can be addressed.

In the interim, we are pleased to highlight the artwork of the show's co-curator, Aimee Wissman, along with that of returned artists Whitney Johnson and Jayme Santini. The work of currently incarcerated artists Michael and John, who were able to submit their work to us, is also included.

Trust the Process Co-Curator Aimee Wissman serves on the steering team of the Ohio Prison Arts Connection and is the creator of the Returning Artists Guild along with Kamisha Thomas. Since Wissman's release from prison she has networked relentlessly, and built relationships with a variety of Institutions, Artists, Teachers and Activists. In her artist statement, Aimee says that she was born an artist, but grew up a junkie. Heroin was her first love and it became her life.
